August Wilson

August Wilson (April 27, 1945 - October 2, 2005) authored Gem of the Ocean, Joe Turner's Come and Gone, Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, The Piano Lesson, Seven Guitars, Fences, Two Trains Running, Jitney, King Hedley II, and Radio Golf. These works explore the heritage and experience of African-Americans, decadeby-decade, over the course of the twentieth century. His plays have been produced at regional theaters across the country and all over the world, as well as on Broadway. In 2003, Mr. Wilson made his professional stage debut in his one-man show, How I Learned What I Learned. Mr. Wilson's works garnered many awards including Pulitzer Prizes for *Fences* (1987); and for *The Piano Lesson* (1990); a Tony Award for *Fences*; Great Britain's Olivier Award for Jitney; as well as eight New York Drama Critics Circle Awards for Ma Rainey's Black Bottom, Fences, Joe Turner's Come and Gone, The Piano Lesson, Two Trains Running, Seven Guitars, Jitney, and Radio Golf. Additionally, the cast recording of Ma Rainey's Black Bottom received a 1985 Grammy Award, and Mr. Wilson received a 1995 Emmy Award nomination for his screenplay adaptation of *The Piano Lesson*. Mr. Wilson's early works included the one-act plays The Janitor. Recycle. The Coldest Day of the Year, Malcolm X. The Homecoming and the musical satire Black Bart and the Sacred Hills.

Mr. Wilson received many fellowships and awards, including Rockefeller and Guggenheim Fellowships in Playwrighting, the Whiting Writers Award, 2003 Heinz Award, was awarded a 1999 National Humanities Medal by the President of the United States, and received numerous honorary degrees from colleges and universities, as well as the only high school diploma ever issued by the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh. He was an alumnus of New Dramatists, a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, a 1995 inductee into the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and on October 16, 2005, Broadway renamed the theater located at 245 West 52nd Street - The August Wilson Theatre. Additionally, Mr. Wilson was posthumously inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame in 2007.

Mr. Wilson was born and raised in the Hill District of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania and lived in Seattle, Washington at the time of his death. He is immediately survived by his two daughters, Sakina Ansari and Azula Carmen Wilson, and his wife, costume designer Constanza Romero.

William T. Newman, Jr. (Actor) (he/his) is a busy and familiar stage, screen, TV, and voiceover performer. He received his BFA in Acting from Ohio University and his JD from Catholic University. His credits include the critically acclaimed role of Jack Jefferson in The Great White Hope at Ohio Valley Summer Theatre, Preacher Oedipus in The Gospel at Colonus at Avant Bard Theatre (nominated for a Helen Hayes award for Best Musical Ensemble), and Cutler in Ma Rainey's Black Bottom at 1st Stage (nominated for a Helen Hayes award for Outstanding Best Dramatic Ensemble). Washington audiences will remember his appearances at Arena Stage in Julius Caesar and The Winter's Tale and at Mosaic Theater Company DC in Fabulation. His theatre credits also include starring roles in Plaza Suite, Ceremonies in Dark Old Men, and Let's Get Sanctified. On network TV, he had a recurring role as Hal Johnson on the daytime soap opera Somerset. Motion picture credits include Suspect and Lee Daniel's The Butler.

Director

DeMone Seraphin (Director) (he/his) is a Helen Hayes Award nominee for his direction of *Topdog/Underdog* (Avant Bard Theatre). Other directing credits include the Off-Broadway revivals of *Split Second* and *The Exonerated*, the world premiere musical *Once Uponzi Time: A Tale of An American Scheme* at the McCarter Theatre, Off-Broadway premieres of *Yours Truly, Ella! A Celebration of The Ella Fitzgerald Songbook* and *The King*, and *The Final Hours*, an Elvis Presley musical. International productions include the German premiere of August Wilson's *Jitney, Barnum*, and the musical *Runaways*. As an actor, DeMone has appeared on Broadway, nationally, and internationally in *Miss Saigon*, *Rent*, *Ragtime*, *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Ain't Misbehavin'*, and *Man of La Mancha*. DeMone is an Avant Bard Producing Partner and the Founding Artistic Director of The New American Theatre Co. NY.
